

**National Child Labour Project (NCLP):**

The project seeks to rehabilitate children withdrawn from work through special schools with focus on children engaged in hazardous occupations. The package of benefits to child labour for their rehabilitation includes education, vocation training, nutrition, health care, recreation, stipend etc. The other activities include strict enforcement of child labour related laws, raising awareness against the evils of child labour and extension of welfare activities to child labour. A Gender Based Analysis (GBA) statement of Public Expenditure and number of beneficiaries during 2005-2006 are given below:-
